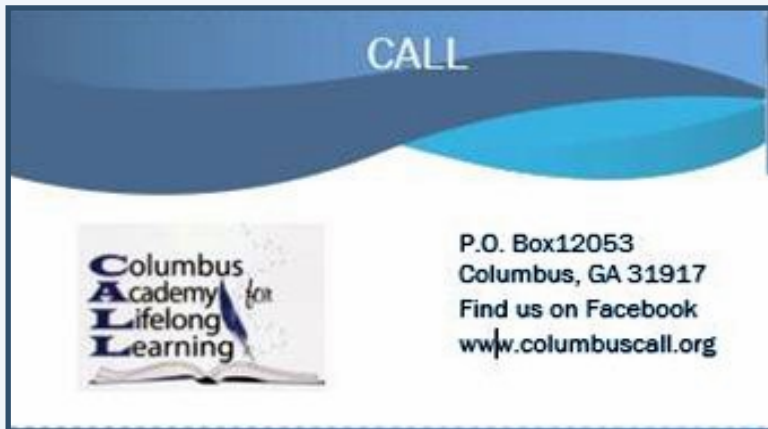

Spring Out of Town Trip

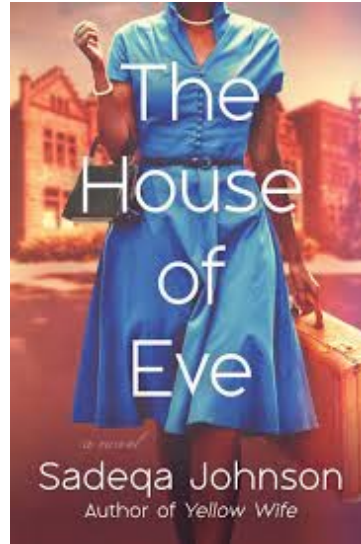

The Spring Social Trip

On Friday April 14th, we will meet the CSU bus in the parking lot of the Wynn House (1240 Wynnton Road, across from the Columbus Museum) in time to depart at 10:00 a.m. Tour guide Victor Feliciano will join us for his very popular Vicinity Tours *Ante Bellum Tour* featuring homes and places in the Wynnton-Midtown area of Columbus. Estates built on wide-open country stood the test of progress. We will see over 30 points of interest, with views of up to 100 outstanding homes, demonstrating rich styles of architecture in Wynnton, Weracoba, and Downtown Historical District.

The tour will last approximately two hours, with occasional stopping and getting out to stretch or admire something. We will return to the parking lot about noon, where we can enjoy a prepaid light lunch (fixed menu) at the Wynn House. Cost is \$30.00 (cash or check payable to CALL) and must be paid at registration, and includes the tour and lunch. For those not wanting to stay for lunch, the price is \$20.00. Lunch only is \$20.00.

This information does NOT automatically transfer to the new quarter. CSU takes these forms and produces our class rosters. Registration for Spring 2022 - 2023 classes will be at CSU's Elizabeth Bradley Turner Center on March 8th. Come at 1:30 p.m. for time to visit with others during our social. Beginning at 2:00 p.m. the facilitators will be presenting information about their classes and activities.

This quarter offers the Geology of National Parks, New History of the American South, The Color of Law, Shakespeare in Work and Action, and Epic Engineering Failures and the Lessons They Teach. Learn about our plans for our out-of-town trip and the end-of-year celebration. You received an email with the Synopsis, listing all the classes and events, and included the form for registration.
